Sleepy Hollow Road Construction

Construction on Sleepy Hollow Road is underway from County Line Road south to the Village limits. The project consists of improvements to the storm sewer system, curb and gutter, roadway surface and subbase, intersection street lighting, and sidewalks and asphalt trails. Total construction costs for this project is

\$2,789,644.

Residents are advised of detours in place for the duration of the project. Thru-traffic will be detoured to Randall Road, while local traffic in adjacent neighborhoods should use County Line Road and Longmeadow Parkway for access. The overall project is expected to be completed in November, weather permitting.

Drivers in this project area should be prepared to reduce their speed, exercise caution, watch for construction workers and construction vehicles entering or leaving the site, and obey flaggers and other traffic control devices within the work zone. FY 19/20 Budget

On April 16, 2019, the Village Board unanimously approved the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 annual budget for the Village of Algonquin. The Village's \$66.7 million budget is used as a tool to assist Village officials in making sound and rational choices for the provision of public services.

Every Drop Counts: Water Conservation Regulations

The Village of Algonquin would like to remind residents the importance of water conservation and how to save water. Simple ideas for saving water include covering your swimming pool when not using it, doing only full loads of dishes/clothes, turning off water when brushing your teeth, watering landscaping early morning or at night, using a rain barrel, setting your mower blades higher and fixing leaks right away. The Village reminds you that summer watering restrictions are in place. To check current water system status, see signs posted on primary streets in the Village, call us at 847-658-2700, or look on the Village's website www.algonquin.org/waterstatus.

<u>CONSERVATION</u>: Green signs indicate outside water use is permitted except for watering landscaping and lawns which is prohibited between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

EVEN/ODD: Yellow signs indicate even/odd days for watering before 9:00 a.m. and after 6:00 p.m. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days, and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days before 9:00 a.m. and after 6:00 p.m. **EVEN/ODD 6:00 9:00 A M : Orange** signs indicate even/odd days for watering enty between the baurs of 6:00 p.m.

EVEN/ODD 6:00-9:00 A.M.: Orange signs indicate even/odd days for watering only between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days, and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.

<u>RESTRICTED</u>: *Red* signs indicate no outside water use is allowed at any time. This includes all use of water outside, such as washing vehicles, power washing, and watering landscaping.



Water Meter Replacements

The Village is currently at its half-way point of its three-year water meter replacement program. The new meters will automatically transmit readings wirelessly, increasing efficiency and reducing costs by eliminating time-consuming manual meter reading altogether. United Meters, Inc.
