Village Receives \$400,000 Grant for Stoneybrook Park The Village has been awarded a \$400,000 Open Space Land Acquisition and Development (OSLAD) grant for the

improvement of Stoneybrook Park in Algonquin. Last improved in 1997, Stoneybrook Park will be redeveloped to add several new amenities including bocce ball courts, pickleball courts, a gaga ball pit, a pavilion, walking trail, and a 15-space parking lot. Additionally, the existing playground and sand volleyball court will be replaced and improved.

Preliminary total cost estimates for the Stoneybrook Park improvement project are \$930,000, with the OSLAD grant providing \$400,000 to this total. Construction on the Stoneybrook Park improvement project is anticipated to begin in late 2020 and be completed in summer 2021.

Algonquin Community Survey

In September 2019, the Algonquin Community Survey was sent to 1,500 randomly selected households in the community. Overall, the top quality of life measures in the Village rated positively by residents include Algonquin as a place to live (94.6%), your neighborhood as a place to live (93.8%), and Algonquin as a place to raise children (93.3%). The overall response rate for the survey was 16.1%. The Algonquin Community Survey helps the Village evaluate and prioritize public services provided to the community. Clean Up After Your Pet

Algonquin has over 20 miles of trails and walking paths in our community. They are a great amenity as the snow melts and we welcome the spring weather. Please remember if you are headed out with your pet to bring a few bags and clean up any pet waste when on your walk.

Pet waste contains fecal coliform bacteria such as **Salmonella** and **E. coli** which can contaminate our surface and ground water. Additionally, animals, humans, and objects may also contact these bacteria in areas where waste is left on the surface. Please be sure to dispose of your pet's waste responsibly.

Spring Hydrant Flushing

As a regular maintenance practice, the Village of Algonquin flushes fire hydrants throughout the Village twice a year. Spring hydrant flushing is performed in six different zones and will begin on April 6, concluding May 29. Residents are encouraged to avoid using water while hydrant flushing is taking place as temporary losses of water pressure and water discoloration may be possible. Spring Cleanup

In April, the Village, along with Groot, will sponsor a Village-wide cleanup program for single-family residences and townhomes that currently receive residential refuse and recycling services. This program is to encourage residents to reduce fire hazards in their homes and to "spruce up" their neighborhoods. STICKERS ARE NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS SPECIAL PICKUP. Typical items to be discarded include toys, clothes, couches. beds, dressers, and patio furniture.

Free Leaf & Brush Collection

Groot will provide free collection of leaves and branches (tied in bundles which are not more than 4 feet in length and 2 feet in diameter) April 16 - May 1. Leaves must be placed in standard paper yardwaste bags or reusable containers that are clearly marked with a red "X." Place the bags or cans at the curb on your regular collection day. Leaves placed in loose piles will NOT be collected.

Grass clippings and other yardwaste will still require a collection sticker. Any bags or cans that contain leaves mixed with other yardwaste will also require a collection sticker. The stickers for garbage and yardwaste are interchangeable. Please contact Groot at 800-244-1977 with questions regarding leaf and brush collection.

Reducing Stormwater Pollution

The following are some tips to help prevent stormwater pollution and protect our natural resources in Algonquin:

- 1. Never dump anything down a storm drain. Always recycle used oil, antifreeze and other fluids. Fix oil leaks in your vehicles.
- 2. Wash your car at a commercial car wash rather than in the street or in your driveway.
- 3. Cut down on fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides. If you use these chemicals, follow directions and use them sparingly. Don't fertilize before a rainstorm.
- 4. Compost or mulch lawn clippings.
- 5. Pick up after your pets and keep animals out of streams. Scoop up your pets waste and properly dispose of it.
